Service Mark

Structured Dialogic DesignSM is now a registered Service Mark (trademark) of the Institute for 21st Century Agoras.

AGORAS controls the use of the mark by the members in the following manner:

Licensed SDD practitioners understand the science of Structured Dialogic Design and follow its rules. In preparation, they:

- Read *How people harness their collective wisdom and power*
- Participate in previous SDD sessions under the supervision of experienced SDD practitioners in the roles of recorder, software operator, and lead facilitator
- Receive official written certification from the Executive Director of the Institute for 21st Century Agoras as authorized SDD practitioners

In addition,

- They provide their preliminary research and their main triggering question to AGORAS before running their SDD sessions.
- They also report vital statistics and results to AGORAS subsequent to their sessions
- SDD sessions must be implemented under the control of an individual who has been authorized to practice SDD.
- SDD practice will be approved by an audit of documents created during an SDD session.
- The Executive Director of the AGORAS will also approve distribution of software to support the practice of SDD.

- The *Harnessing* book is to be cited explicitly as the criteria for calling a practice SDD.
- The SDD mark will provide evidence that structured dialogic design has been implemented in accordance with the canons of the practice.

Structured Dialogic Design depends on faithful execution for its extraordinary success. Its structure separates it from less coherent facilitation and management methods. This service mark will maintain the integrity of the SDD brand by preventing the invocation of SDD by any slipshod applications.

Michigan's Integrated Mathematics Initiative (MIMI)

Below is an official announcement of a Michigan program utilizing SDD.

Alignment for Sustainability: The MIMI Program The goal of Michigan's Integrated Mathematics Initiative (MIMI) is: To braid and blend existing initiatives to promote a cohesive system of mathematics resources supported by MDE to ensure success for ALL students. On the basis of content and structural analyses of the responses to seven questions by a panel of content experts, we intend to design and conduct three co-laboratories with a group of approximately twenty-five stakeholders in accordance with the framework shown below:

The three preliminary triggering questions of the colabs, to be conducted in early 2010 are:

A) Co-laboratory I: "What Ought to be": [March 17 – 18]

“What do you think Michigan teachers and schools “ought to do” for ALL students to learn math?”

B) Co-laboratory II: "What Can be": [April 15-16]

“What are barriers to what “ought to be done” for all students to learn math?”

C) Co-laboratory III: "What will be": [Virtual]

Core team reviews meta-components of feedback thus far – what issues need to be overcome from a state project standpoint (constraint will inform delivery medium, etc.); Bring back to larger group (transfer agents or entire group) to review and provide input –would it achieve “the ought”?

“What are action options which, if adopted and implemented by the community of stakeholders, will overcome the system of inhibitors (or close the GAP) identified in Co-laboratory II, and hence facilitate the establishment of a viable model for learning mathematics by ALL students in schools in Michigan by 2015?”

Establishing an Observatorium

A long-time dream of Aleco, John Warfield, Yiannis Laouris, and others is coming to pass in Cyprus. An Observatorium is being established in a town of Cyprus. The following description is taken from an article by Warfield entitled The Corporate Observatorium

The Observatorium is a physical (or virtual) piece of real estate, whose building interior can be loosely compared with that of the Louvre, in that it contains a variety of rooms, and facilitates rapid familiarization with their contents by the persons who walk through that property. The displays in the Observatorium are tailored to help eradicate or minimize complexity in understanding, both broadly and in depth, the nature of the large organization, its problems, its vision, and its ongoing efforts to resolve its difficulties. Comparison with the planetarium for envisaging a broad swatch of the sky is self-evident.

The first step in resolving issues related to large, complex systems, is to provide a well-designed situation room, equipped to enable groups to work together effectively. The second step is to carry out whatever prolonged design work is required, using processes proven to be effective, yielding visual displays of the system patterns that hold understanding of the logic underlying the system. The third step is to embed the results of the second step in the corporate Observatorium, where insight into the large, complex system comes both at overview and detailed levels, according to the efforts put forth to comprehend what is seen in the sequenced displays.

The first two steps have been accomplished in a variety of settings. It remains to take up the challenge to develop the first corporate Observatory which may then become a prototype for its successors.
